School Rules and Regulations

1. Students should wear the prescribed school uniform on working days, examination days and for all school functions.
2. Students should attend the morning prayer. They shall stand respectfully for the National Anthem whenever it is sung.
3. Punctuality and regular attendance is insisted upon. Late comers and absentees should get the Late Attendance Record and Absence Record signed by the parents / guardians. In case of long illness, a medical fitness certificate will have to be produced.
4. Students are not allowed to meet parents or visitors or to leave the premises during school hours. In case of emergency a written request should be made by the parent.
5. **Students will not be called to the telephone during school hours. In case of emergency the message will be conveyed to them.**
6. No magazines, CD's, toys, cameras, electronic gadgets or sophisticated articles must be brought to school. Exchange of articles or money transactions between students is not allowed.
7. **Mobile Phones are strictly forbidden in the school campus.**
8. **Students are not allowed to collect money to buy gifts for teachers, friends or for celebrations without the knowledge or permission of the Principal.**
9. Only **vegetarian** food should be brought to school. Avoid unhealthy junk food which have harmful additives (e.g. aij-no-moto, pan masalas, Lays etc.) and are injurious to health.
10. Only English should be spoken in the school premises to acquire greater facility in communicative skill.
11. **Read good English books and English newspapers to develop proficiency in the English Language and to improve general awareness.**
12. **Students are not allowed to purchase junk food, sweets, chewing gum, ice-cream, soft drinks etc. from unauthorized dealers / hawkers near the school premises.**

13. Students shall be responsible for their personal belongings, books, lunch boxes, umbrellas, watches etc. Personal belongings should have a name so that any unclaimed property can be returned to the owner.
14. Students are forbidden to scribble on the walls / furniture or dirty the classrooms or damage any property in the school. Parents will have to compensate for any damage caused to the school property.
15. Every student must take part in school games and other activities unless rendered medically unfit or exempted by the Principal. **Students are not allowed to be in the class during games period.**
16. To inculcate the spirit of patriotism and an awareness of Indian culture and heritage, various cultural activities and national festivals are observed. **It is obligatory for all students to attend such functions.**
17. Politeness and courtesy is expected. Every students is urged to maintain the high moral and spiritual standards set for the school by his/her manner and conduct. They are answerable to the school authorities for their conduct even outside the school.
18. Students should come neatly dressed to school.
19. **Simple wrist watches are allowed only from Std III upwards. Watches with calculators, digital watches and fancy watches which cause distraction in the class are strictly for-bidden.**
20. Students should not be seen loitering in the town or local shops, icecream parlours etc. after class hours.
21. Students should read the rules and follow them strictly. The school reserves the right to suspend or dismiss a student on grounds of irregular attendance, habitual lack of application, malpractice or objectionable behaviour not in keeping with the good tone of the school, inside the premises or elsewhere.

To Parents and Guardians

1. Parents are requested to co-operate with the school authorities by taking interest in the progress of their children and enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline.
2. An Open House Meet is held every month. Parents / guardians are requested to attend the meet and discuss their child's/ward's progress with the teachers.
3. Parents are requested not to criticize the school or teachers in front of the students. Those who wish to seek any clarification, information or make any suggestions or complaint should do so directly to the Principal, and not to the Class Teacher.
4. The Principal can be met during school hours on all working days in the office only and **not at his/her residence**.
5. Unit and Terminal Assessments will be conducted from time to time to assess the performance of students. Those who are ill should produce a Medical Certificate for absence.
6. Answer Papers and Progress Reports will be sent to the parents after every Assessment. Parents are requested to go through the Answer Papers and Progress Report carefully and return it to the Class Teacher within 2 days, duly signed. On non-receipt of the answer papers and progress report, parents are requested to contact the Principal / Headmistress / Class Teacher.
7. Parents are requested not to send children to school when they are suffering from any contagious or infections disease. After recovery they must bring a fitness certificate from the doctor certifying that the child is fit to attend the class and the disease unlikely to spread to others.
8. Parents are requested not to give money to their children, (unless on written request from the school) except money absolutely necessary.
9. Parents must ensure that no child remains in the school premises after 4.15 p.m unless instructed by the school authorities.
10. Parents are requested to see that their children come neatly and smartly dressed.
11. Parents should encourage their children to take active part in the co-curricular activities of the school and national and cultural celebrations. **Expose your child to Indian Culture and Heritage.**

12. Parents are requested not to enter classrooms and meet the teachers during school hours. If they wish to meet the teacher, they may do so only after getting prior appointment through the Principal / Headmistress.
- 13. Parents should check the diary and note the communications from the teachers. Also note that the homework set and see that the work is done.**
14. Parents are requested to give the children enough time to relax and not to pressurize and overburden with extra classes.
15. Restrict the time spent on watching TV and using the Computer. Be selective in watching good TV programmes. Avoid programmes with violence (Continuous exposure will lead to temper tantrums, restlessness, nightmares, poor handwriting).
16. Students should work out a home timetable and set aside time for home study and relaxation after school hours, instead of overloading with various extra classes before and after school hours without consulting the teachers.
17. Parents are requested to read the rules carefully and see that they are followed. Please note that the rules are subject to modification in the interest of the pupil and the school.
18. Entrusting a pupil to the school implies that parents agree to stand by the rules and regulations of the school. They are respected to see that the children also abide by the school regulations.
19. Phone/Mobile communication with teachers should be in between 7 pm to 8 pm

EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION RULES

Based on the National Curriculum Framework 2005, CBSE has introduced Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) in 2009.

CCE is followed from Class-I onwards. It is a School based assessment system catering to the all round development of the child. CCE is a continuous evaluation over a period of time & comprehensive in that it incorporates both scholastic & co-scholastic levels of learning.

The assessment is carried out over two terms - **Term 1** and **Term 2** by means of formative and summative assessments.

Grading Scale

Assessment of Scholastic attainment will be reported twice in a year in **one academic session**.

The nine-point grading scale for measuring Scholastic achievement is given below:

Minimum qualifying grade in all the subjects Under Scholastic Domain is D.

All assessment with regard to the academic status of the students shall be done in marks and the assessment will be given in grades.

Appearing in both Formative and Summative Assessment is mandatory.

Co-Scholastic areas will consists of Life Skills, Attitudes and Values, Co-Scholastic activities and health and Physical education.

Co-Scholastic attainment will be done on 5-point Scale as shown in the table below. It will be done once in an academic session.

For Primary Classes:

- (i) Promotion from classes I and II shall be decided on the basis of continuous and comprehensive assessment made every month of the work done in the class and assignments given to the children.

- (ii) Promotion from class I to class V may be made on the basis of the total performance in periodical and mid-session tests / or informal final test. It is expected that stagnation through failures will be nil or absolutely minimized in these classes. The assessments of competencies and skills shall be made on a five point scale viz. A+, A, B, C & D where D stands for scope of improvement.

Examination Committee

There is an Examination Committee to conduct all types of tests and examinations in the school. The Principal will be the Chairman of this Committee. It shall have at least four to five members of the staff besides the Principal serving on it. The Principal may co-opt. class teachers / subject teachers, wherever necessary, at his discretion. The Examination Committee shall be an internal committee of the Vidyalaya and shall be constituted every year, so that it keeps a regular watch on the progress of the pupils. The functions of the Ex-amination Committee will be:

- i) To prepare guidelines for paper setters for class tests and examinations in different subject areas and to decide about the weightage to be given to different instructional objectives, types and kinds of questions to be set and marking procedure to be adopted.

Re-examination and Re-evaluation

- i) The Principal shall conduct re-examination or re evaluation.
- ii) In case of grave complaints of foul play, these matters will be referred to the Assistant Commissioner. In situations where the Assistant Commissioner is satisfied that the evaluation process in the session - ending examination or the mid-term examination has not been fair, he may order only scrutiny of answer books of session-ending examination in cases where the child has scored very good marks in other subjects and failed in one or two sub-jects. Scrutiny will cover only re-totalling and marking of un-marked answers etc.

ATTENDANCE & SCHOOL TIMINGS

1. A pupil will be eligible to appear in the Session ending Examination if he/she has obtained 80% attendance.
2. Leave for absence is granted to students only on an application addressed to the Principal through Class Teacher submitted in time, duly attested by the Parents / Guardian.

3. The period of leave with reasons should also be recorded in the Students Calendar by the Parent with signature.
4. In case of illness, a Medical Certificate must be attached with the application. Long absence except in case of illness should be discouraged.
5. The name of the student will be struck off the rolls of the Vidyalaya if he/she is absent for more than a week continuously without sanction of leave.
6. School timing: From 9.00 am to 4.00 pm. Student should reach the school at least by 9.15 am.

PUNCTUALITY AND REGULARITY

1. The pupil must develop the habits of punctuality and regularity.
2. He/She should reach the Vidyalaya at least five minutes before the commencement of the prayer assembly.
3. He/She should submit his assignment and projects to the teachers regularly and in time.
4. He/She must not absent himself for the unit tests without getting permission from the subject-teachers before hand.
5. He/She may apply for leave only when it is absolutely necessary. The leave letter must be submitted to the Class Teacher well in time. He should submit the leave letter to the Principal if he seeks leave or absence for more than three days. A medical certificate must be furnished if the period of leave exceeds seven days in case of absence on medical grounds.

LIBRARY RULES

1. All students of the school are members of the Library.

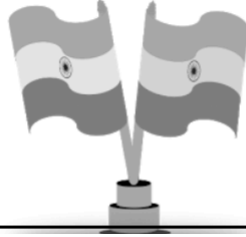
